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Introduction

- Excellent verbal and written communication skills to effectively interact with study participants and accurately record information.
- Willing to travel extensively to all the villages, and spend quality time with the field investigators, beneficiaries and communities.
- Familiarity with research ethics and guidelines for human subject's research.
- Fluency in written and spoken Kannada & English language.
- Good facilitation skills and abilities to work with multi-disciplinary stake-holders at the grass root level.
- Should be a good team person with ability to work collaboratively with other team members and researchers.
- Desirable: Minimum 3 years' experience in research (or) programmatic experience with research orientation. Work in Maternal/Child Health projects desirable, surveillance activity research, including monitoring and supervision. Knowledge of computer applications and statistical packages.

Roles and Responsibilities



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- Oversee the research study and handle communication with State & District Health Dept. officials on regular basis
- Coordinate the baseline situational assessment of the health facilities and help in implementation of district-wide intervention package
- Provide training, mentorship, and capacity-building to project staff, including nurses and community health workers.
- Support MNCH activities in the hospital and in the district.
- Supervise and conduct surveillance activities, including monitoring and evaluation of project interventions.
- Frequent travel to Karnataka districts for on-site training and supportive supervision
- Analyze and interpret data related to maternal and child health outcomes, ensuring accurate reporting.
- Help in developing training material, conducting literature search, data management, report writing and contribute to publications
- Manage project resources, budget, and overall administration, ensuring efficient project execution and compliance.
- Supporting advocacy work of the project at all levels.
- Communication: Maintain regular communication with the research team, providing updates on progress, challenges and any emerging findings.
- Training: Participate in training sessions and capacity-building workshops to enhance qualitative data collection skills and knowledge.
- Maintaining records of work progress and report monthly activities
- Ensuring ethical principles in terms of confidentiality/coding and sharing of data and MIS operations; generating statistical reports at district level.
